

oseph "Joe" Charles Galvin, age 84, of Naperville, IL, passed away on Sunday, January 30, 2022, with his family at his side. Joe was born November 13, 1937, in Des Moines, IA; the son of George and Loretta (nee Trout) Galvin. Joe was united in marriage October 13,1962, to his treasured wife Marjorie "Margie" Sonneville of Moline, IL.

Joe was very proud of his family. He is survived by wife, Margie, son, Tom (Deb) Galvin of Coppell, Texas; daughter, Julie (Tony) Schaschwary of Naperville, and 5 grandchildren: Calissa Galvin, Caitie Galvin, Kevin Galvin, Emily Schaschwary and Eric Schaschwary. Joe honorably served in the United States Army Reserve. Joe was a CPA who worked his entire 40-year career at International Harvester (IH, later becoming Navistar). While at IH, he worked as a comptroller at manufacturing plants in Moline IL, East Moline IL, Canton, IL, Memphis, TN and Louisville, KY. Joe and his family settled in Naperville in 1983, where he continued to work for Navistar in the Chicago area until retiring in 2001.

Joe made countless friends wherever he lived and had many special close friends in Louisville and Naperville that he considered to be part of his extended family. Always a gentleman, Joe was always more concerned about his family and friends than he was about himself. Joe was an active member of the Catholic Church. In Naperville, he served as a Pre-Cana marriage counselor and often volunteered at the food pantry at St. Thomas the Apostle Church.
