While working on his Masters degree, Patrick began a highly successful 38-year career with International Harvester/Navistar. Patrick's many roles included Director of Purchasing, Vice President of Engine Engineering and Vice President of Government Relations. During his engine engineering tenure, Patrick led the company's development of Green Diesel Technology, which is still used today in all modern low-emissions car and truck diesel engines in the United States and Europe. Patrick retired from Navistar in February of 2014. During his career at Navistar, one of Patrick's many accolades included him being named in 1997's November issue of Crain's magazine as one of Chicago's 100 most Influential Technology Players Patrick and Rosanna's extensive travels were driven by their insatiable quest for learning and their love for not only automobiles and automobile museums but by their love for the arts, music, history, architecture, majestic views and culture.
