Here are some news items from Navistar:

- International Truck unveiled a product design focus called "Driver First", aimed at giving its customers an edge in attracting and retaining qualified drivers through vehicles designed with a strong emphasis on the driver's perspective.
- On June 9, Navistar announced it has reached an agreement with General Motors to manufacture the cutaway model of GM's G Van at Navistar's Springfield, Ohio, plant,

starting in the first half of 2017. With this multi-year contract, Navistar will add at least 300 jobs and recommission its second line at the plant.

- Navistar's second quarter (ending April 30) net income was \$4 million on revenues of \$2.2 billion. The Parts Segment achieved record quarterly profits. The quarter ended with \$817 million of consolidated cash, cash equivalents and marketable securities. Due to an industry slow-down, the Company does not expect to show a full-year profit for 2016.
- Navistar was the recipient of the 2016 CIO 100, an annual award program that recognizes organizations around the world that exemplify the highest level of operational and strategic excellence in Information Technology. The award related to Navistar's "On Command Connection", a remote diagnostics service that helps customers achieve significantly improved on-road uptime for their trucks and buses.
- Effective July 1, Blue Diamond Truck and International Gas Supplier will merge into Navistar Mexico.
- Nathan Reed, Dan Myers and Robert Ball won the Top Service Technicians Awards at the Navistar North American and Global Technician Rodeos for 2016.

Mark your calendars for the next NICARC event on December 7. You will be entertained by Nancy Baumet and Dia Madden, with their "Sweet Reminders" program.

Remember, we are always looking for new people to serve on the NICARC Board. One person expressed some interest on the feedback forms.
